## Large Patch

If you are seeing large patch fungus in turf, there is not much to do but wait for regrowth. Prevention is key with no nitrogen applied to turfgrasses after September 15 and careful water-as-needed practices. Fungus is most active in Fall and Spring.



## Thinning Vegetables

Many cool season vegetable seeds are very tiny and we end up with more in a space than we need. Don't neglect thinning out young seedlings so plants are left growing with the proper spacing. This will ensure you have room for plant root and shoot development.



## Yellow Senna

We have to wait all season for the bright yellow blooms of one of our Senna species, *Senna bicapsularis*. Other sennas bloom earlier in the season but this semi evergreen tree/shrub is a Fall accent plant.

Yellow senna often grows as a multi-stemmed plant and can reach 6-12 feet in height depending on the site and winter protection. It can be damaged by a hard freeze and is prone to breakage with heavy winds but returns each Spring. Also a host to the Sulphur butterfly, Yellow senna is a low maintenance plant deserving of a spot in many landscapes.
